Spanish director and set designer Paco Azorin, born in 1974, trained at Institut del Teatre in Barcelona. He has signed 250 works in the field of opera, prose, zarzuela and dance, within the most prestigious European theatres. Amongst these are *María Moliner* by Antoni Parera Fons, *Otello* by G. Verdi, *Salome* by Richard Strauss (Festival di Mérida), *Una voce in off* by Xavier Montsalvatge (Gran Teatre del Liceu), *Jerusalem* by Giuseppe Verdi (Theater Bonn), *Manon Lescaut* by Giacomo Puccini (Opéra National de Lyon), *La Voix Humaine* by Francis Poulenc (Teatros del Canal e Gran Teatre del Liceu), *Tosca* by Puccini (Gran Teatre del Liceu and Teatro de la Maestranza), *Julio César* by William Shakespeare (59 Festival Internacional de Teatro Classico de Mérida).

As a fond Shakespearean, in 2003 he founded and directed for four years the Shakespeare Festival of Santa Susana promoting the world premiere of Le jour des meurtres dans l'histoire d'Hamlet by Bernard-Marie Koltès.

As a set designer he has worked for many years with director Lluís Pasqual (La casa di Bernarda Alba, Amleto, La tempesta, Quitt) and Carme Portaceli (Riccardo III, Lear, Prometeo, La nostra clase). He also collaborated with Mario Gas, Francisco Negrin, Helena Pimenta, Sergi Belbel, Victor Ullate and Ernesto Caballero.

The list of his awards runs long. To begin with the *Otello* by *Verdi*, that will soon be at the Festival di Macerata (best productione 2015 - Premio Campoamor), and continue with Ceres 2013, Crítica Serra d'Or 2004, Butaca 2004 e 2009, Premio Josep Solbes 2005.

In Italy he has distinguished himself, last year, signing the *Don Giovanni* by **W. A. Mozart** (Teatro di Sassari). His upcoming projects with melodrama include *Turandot* by **G. Puccini** (Festival di Peralada), *Werther* by **J. Massenet**.
